I can identify the five kinds of prayer.

I can understand and explain that everyone will have their own personal preference on what type of prayer they use.

The materials you will need are: religion book, pencil, and paper

Step 1: Before beginning the lesson I want you to take a minute and say a prayer. This could be your own personal prayer or saying one of the prayers we say at school. (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be, or Saint Michael)

Step 2: Read page 181. **Do not go onto the activity till later on in the lesson**

Step 3: Once you have read page 181 I want you to take a piece of paper, fold it in half and then into thirds. (We have done this many times in class) In each box I want you to write one of the five kinds of prayers and the description of each prayer

Your paper should look something like this:

Step 5: You will now complete the activity at the bottom of page 181. Look at each bible passage listed below and determine what type of prayer is being used.

1. Psalm 148:1-6

Praise the Lord from the heavens;

Praise Him in the heights!

Praise Him, all His angels;
Praise Him, all His hosts!
Praise Him, sun and moon;
Praise Him, all you stars of light!
Praise Him, you heavens of heavens,
And you waters above the heavens.
Let them praise the name of the Lord,
For He commanded and they were created.
He also established them forever and ever;
He made a decree which shall not pass away.

2. Matthew 8:5-13

Now when Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to Him, pleading with Him, **6** saying, “Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, dreadfully tormented.”

7 And Jesus said to him, “I will come and heal him.”

8 The centurion answered and said, “Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed. **9** For I also am a man under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to this *one*, ‘Go,’ and he goes; and to another, ‘Come,’ and he comes; and to my servant, ‘Do this,’ and he does *it*.[”]

10 When Jesus heard *it*, He marveled, and said to those who followed, “Assuredly, I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel! **11** And I say to you that many will come from east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. **12** But the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.” **13** Then Jesus said to the centurion, “Go your way; and as you have believed, *so* let it be done for you.” And his servant was healed that same hour.

3. Ephesians 1:3-6

Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly *places* in Christ, **4** just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, **5** having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, **6** to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He [a]made us accepted in the Beloved.

4. Psalm 139: 13-14

For You formed my inward parts;
You covered me in my mother’s womb.
I will praise You, for I am fearfully *and* wonderfully made;
Marvelous are Your works, And *that* my soul knows very well.

5. Mark 10: 46-52

Now they came to Jericho. As He went out of Jericho with His disciples and a great multitude, blind Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, sat by the road begging. 47 And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Then many warned him to be quiet; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" So Jesus stood still and commanded him to be called. Then they called the blind man, saying to him, "Be of good cheer. Rise, He is calling you." And throwing aside his garment, he rose and came to Jesus. So Jesus answered and said to him, "What do you want Me to do for you?" The blind man said to Him, [a]"Rabboni, that I may receive my sight." Then Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your faith has [b]made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus on the road.
